## **UPLED Seminar – March 2001**

Successful local economic development depends on a clear definition of complementary roles and responsibilities among the key Romanian actors involved in economic development: the public sector, the private sector and LED organizations.

Local government agencies have traditionally had responsibility for spatial planning and, more recently, for related economic planning. A City Development Strategy or Strategic Plan is a recent practice for local governments that brings these functions together by outlining how the public sector can promote its strategic development objectives through more effective local government practices, proactive urban planning and land management and the delivery of physical infrastructure, and social services in cooperation with the private sector.

The three and a half-day seminar included presentations by the cities and topical presentations by international and regional experts. The emphasis was to relate local economic development to challenges and opportunities in each locality with reference to municipal development objectives. The City teams had an opportunity to present and discuss:

- 1. An updated summary of their development strategies;
- 2. The results of their recently prepared three-year capital investment program and efforts to develop a more systematic approach to managing local government financial resources to support their development priorities.
- 3. The identification of potential areas for public/private partnerships.

Two other key areas in the seminar included:

- 1. Improving the effectiveness of local government. Each of the three cities has initiated efforts to strengthen the institutional and organizational linkages between urban planning, capital investment and economic development.
- 2. Legislative initiatives that will enable local governments to proactively use urban development and planning regulations to support their economic development strategies.

International cases were also presented to illustrate other efforts to develop revitalization and economic development strategies and public investment in infrastructure. These included cases from Boston, Paris, Budapest and Szczecin.
